Our overloaded oceans

How Plastic affects the ocean

There are estimated amounts of 270,000 tons of plastic floating on the surface of the ocean. In addition, in just 1 week, from bottled water alone, the US produces enough discarded bottles to circle the planet 5 times.

Sea Turtles

700 species of marine animals may become extinct because of plastic pollution.

Sea turtles, like many marine animals they mistake plastic waste for a viable food. We found that every known species of sea turtle and more than half of all species of marine mammal and seabird had been affected by marine debris.

Whales entangled in derelict fishing gear can endure a slow, painful progression to death over months to years. The problem was highlighted horrifically last year when an emaciated sperm whale stranded on the Mediterranean coast was found to have ingested 26 plastic items, weighing more the 8.1kg and covering an area of 29.9m²
