This is when humans cut down their homes they live in trees and we cut them down.


They have great eyesight and are carnivorous- they eat meat! Little flies are their favorite.

Willow Tree



Altogether, there are around 400 species of willow tree. The dwarf tree rarely grows to 6 centimetres tall (2.4 inches). White willows are the rarest type of willow and grows to around 30 meters tall (100 feet)! Very few live to 100 years old. Willow stems are sometimes used to make 3D sculptures. Here's a sculpture made from Willow trees.

When is the best time to

grow vegetables?

It is important to grow your vegetables at the right time.

Spring is the best time to grow them particularly March and May because that is when it starts to get warmer and it will last longer. Some vegetables, such as Brussel sprouts, take up a lot of space for a long time but are still well-worth the time taken.

Land Animal Cheetah





The cheetah habitat is on land and they are very fast and when cheetahs are running at top speed they travel over 20 feet (7 meters) with each stride. The cubs are born blind, but they can see after about 12 days. They start to open their eyes but still need their mums to help them survive.
