## Our School Day

Children will enter school via the door by the KS2 playground. 8.35 – Doors open 10.25 - 10.45 – Collective Worship 10.45 -11.00 – Break times 12.00 – 13.00 – Lunchtime 15.15 – End of school day and exit via the door by the KS2 playground.

## **Equipment and Uniform**

Children will be provided all the essential equipment, e.g. pencils, rulers, rubbers and therefore will not require the purpose of a pencil case in Year 5. In Year 5, children have the opportunity to earn their pen licence. Once received, a handwriting pen will be provided for them.

#### Water bottle

Children are requested to bring a water bottle to school with them. This will be kept on or near their desk and must only be filled with water and not juice/cordial.

## **Snacks/Tuck**

Children can bring healthy snacks in from home to eat at lunch time. Toast and bagels are available to be ordered daily for morning break time. Please make sure that these are paid for in advance on Parent Pay. Toast – 30p Bagels – 35p

#### **Spellings**

Spellings will go out at the beginning of each new half term. It is vital the children practice these as they will tested each Friday and a record of their scores will be kept for monitoring purposes. Spellings can also be accessed online using their spelling shed logins. Sometimes we do experience problems with the app but you should always be able to access these via the internet server. It is important the children learn these spelling patterns to help them in their writing journey.

#### <u>Maths</u>

Each Friday, children will complete a weekly arithmetic check where they will be tested on their recall of previous skills and new skills currently being taught. If we feel children may benefit from additional support, we will provide this in school but we are also happy to provide addition practice work at home to help further their confidence and understanding.

#### **Creative**

Furthermore, your child will be given a selection of options to choose from each half term and will have return dates set at the bottom of the homework list. We have endeavoured to make the homework as creative as possible and we have done this to encourage parental involvement to help support your child in their work at home. We look forward to celebrating the wonderful creations that your children have done at home.

Although homework is optional, we have been overwhelmed by some of the homework we see throughout the school, so please encourage your child to take an active part in completing their homework.

## **Reading**

To be able to:

Use their knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to read aloud and understand the meaning of new words. Make predictions about what might happen based on what has been implied in a text.

Draw inferences about character's feelings, motives and actions.

Summarise information from texts and identify key details.

Discuss the author's use of language and the impact that this has on the reader.

#### What can you do to help?

Ensure that your child reads to you at least four times a week and encourage them to read a variety of genres in addition to 'drop everything and read (DEaR)' time which has been introduced daily in school.

Whilst reading fiction books with your child, you could discuss what is happening in the story by encouraging them to make predictions and comment upon the characters and the plot.

When reading non-fiction, ask them to pick out key points and discuss different layout features.





Comment upon your child's progress in their reading diary relating to their Accelerated Reader book. Children will follow a pathway for reading, reaching success milestones bronze, silver and gold. Each milestone will be rewarded in school.

#### Accelerated Reader

Children will choose books according to their reading zone. Each half term, children will take an Accelerated Star Reader Test which will determine which "zone" they should be choosing books from. All of the books in our class library are labelled in this way but children are also welcome to read their own books from home. You can check the "zone" of a book using the following website: www.arbookfind.co.uk
