Our School Day

Children will enter school via the door by the KS2 playground.

8.35 – Doors open

8:50am- Learning begins

10.25 - 10.45 - Collective Worship

10.45 -11.00 - Break times

12.00 - 13.00 - Lunchtime

15.15 – End of school day and exit via the door by the KS2 playground.

Class routines and information

During the Autumn Term, PE will take place every Tuesday and Thursday. In the Spring term, PE will take place on Tuesdays and Fridays as the children will be swimming on a Friday. Your child should come fully dressed in their PE kit on the days on which they have PE. During PE lessons, jewellery MUST be removed - if ears are pierced, please ensure your child can remove earrings themselves or are provided with plasters.

Equipment

Each child has access to a small, individual locker which can be used to store their personal items, e.g., coat, packed lunch. Please note that appropriate stationery will be provided so pencil cases are not required. Children are expected to take responsibility for these resources and their own belongings. Parents are asked to ensure that all garments and personal property are clearly labelled. Toys (fidget spinners, match attack cards, etc) are not permitted at school except in specific circumstances, such as end-of-term parties or projects.

iPads

All children in Year 4 will have access to their own iPad which will be used to support and enhance their learning within the classroom.

Water bottle

Staying hydrated is conducive to learning. Please encourage your child to bring a reusable, named bottle of water to school each day. This will be kept on or near their desk and can be topped up as required using the water fountains.

Snacks/Tuck

Children can bring healthy snacks in from home. Toast, pancakes, crumpet, teacakes and bagels are available to be ordered daily for morning break time. Please make sure that these are paid for in advance on Parent Pay.

School Dinners

Pupils may choose either a school dinner or bring a healthy packed lunch from home.

If your child is having a school dinner, please order in advance at home so you know what your child will be eating. All school dinners must be selected and paid for in advance through the school's ParentPay system.

Timetable & Curriculum Overview



After Christmas, there will be a slight change to the timetable as swimming will take place on a Friday. Timetable is subject to change with events that may take place in school.

Homework



Spelling

Spellings will go out at the beginning of each new half term. It is vital the children practice these as they will tested each Friday and a record of their scores will be kept for monitoring purposes. Spellings can also be accessed online at home using their spelling shed logins. Sometimes we do experience problems with the app but you should always be able to access these via the internet server. It is important the children learn these spelling patterns to help them in their writing journey.

Maths

Times tables' knowledge is vital for quick mental maths calculations and problem solving, as well as for many of the units children study in KS2 (division, fractions, percentages). By the end of Year 4, children are expected to know all times tables and related division facts up to x12 and are encouraged to use the



Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) programme to regularly practise and consolidate facts.

In June 2025 (date to be confirmed), Year 4 children will take part in the national statutory Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). The test will assess how well each child knows their multiplication tables up to 12x12, using an online testing tool.

How will the test work?

Children will answer multiplication questions against the clock on a computer or tablet, with 6 seconds to answer each one-mark question in a series of 25. The test will last no longer than 5 minutes and will be marked instantly. Each question will be presented in this format: $8 \times 4 =$

Questions will be selected from the 121 number facts that make up the multiplication tables from 2 to 12, with a particular focus on the 6, 7-, 8-, 9- and 12-times tables as they are considered to be the most challenging. Each question will only appear once in any 25-question series, and children won't be asked to answer question reversals (so if they've answered 3 x 4 they won't be asked about 4 x 3). Multiplication facts will be the only things tested (there will be no problem solving or division facts in the check). Children will practise the test format before the official check begins.

What if a child doesn't do well in the check?

There will be no "pass mark" and no child will "fail" the test. However, we expect children to obtain a score of at least 22 out of 25. The DfE states that the purpose of the check is to help teachers identify which children are falling behind. School-level results won't be made publicly available or be used in league tables but will inform teachers which children require additional support.

Home support

Please help your child with times tables practise. Because the National Curriculum for maths is so extensive, there is an expectation that parents will help their children learn their times tables at home and not rely exclusively on schools to bring them up to speed. Some of the techniques you can use include:

- practising times tables by rote (old-fashioned chanting of each multiplication table).
- asking your child times tables questions out of order, e.g., 'What's 11x12? What's 5x6?'
- asking your child related division facts: 'What's 8 x 4? What's 32 ÷ 4?'
- using arrays to help your child memorise times tables you can use fun objects like Smarties or Lego bricks to make it more entertaining.
- using apps and games to help build speed, e.g., Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS). This activity mirrors the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). The children have accessed this at school and should know how to navigate the website.



When it comes to times tables, speed AND accuracy are important – the more facts your child remembers, the easier it is for them to complete harder calculations.

Times Tables Rock Stars is a fun and challenging programme designed to help students master the times tables. To be a Times Tables Rock Star you need to answer any multiplication fact up to 12×12 in less than 3 seconds!

The goal is for all participating rockers to be Times Tables Rock Stars after 20 weeks.

World famous rock musicians are the best at what they do because they've spent hours practising guitar chords, writing music, or playing on the drums. It's just the same with times tables – all Times Tables Rock Stars need to practise, practise, and practise some more.

Short bursts of daily practise are more effective than spending hours once a week. This is where you come in! For your child to be fully motivated and for them to get the best out of the practise, they need your help. Without your praise and your reminders, without you sitting down next to them or checking their work, practising times tables will not feel important to your child.

Our recommendation is that you are there to help them three evenings a week for half an hour during the first two weeks. This will help to establish a routine. After that, we recommend that you help your child get started for the first 10 minutes and then check on them at the end.

Over the course of the next few weeks and months, your child WILL get faster and more accurate with the times tables. All your hard work and theirs WILL make them a Times Tables Rock Star!

Creative

Furthermore, your child will be given a selection of options to choose from each half term and will have return dates set at the bottom of the homework list. We have endeavoured to make the homework as creative as possible and we have done this to encourage parental involvement to help support your child in their work at home. We look forward to celebrating the wonderful creations that your children have done at home.

Although homework is optional, we have been overwhelmed by some of the homework we see throughout the school, so please encourage your child to take an active part in completing their homework.

Reading

Children should engage in reading at home at least four times a week, with an adult's signature in their reading diaries to ensure they receive their stamp. By Year 4, students are expected to read for a minimum of 15 to 20 minutes per session. This duration is crucial for making meaningful progress in their reading each week and developing consistent reading habits.

It is essential that children not only read but also fully comprehend the material they are engaging with. To support this, encourage them to choose books that are suited to their level of understanding and challenge them in a manageable way. You can play an active role by asking thoughtful questions about the content of their books, promoting deeper thinking and discussion. While independent reading is important, continue to motivate them to read aloud occasionally. This practice helps improve fluency and provides an opportunity to address any challenges with pronunciation or unfamiliar vocabulary.



When children encounter words they do not understand, encourage them to seek clarification, whether by discussing the words with you or using reference materials. Expanding their vocabulary in this way will enhance their comprehension and overall enjoyment of reading.

Your involvement is key in fostering a positive reading experience, helping your child develop both literacy skills and a genuine love for reading. By creating an encouraging and supportive environment, you will help your child build the confidence and understanding needed to become a strong, independent reader.

Accelerated Reader

Children will choose school reading books according to their reading zone. Each half-term, children will take an Accelerated Star Reader Test which will determine which "zone" they should be choosing books from. All books in our class library are labelled in this way but children are also welcome to read books from home which fall within their reading zone. Trips

At the beginning of Year 4, children with participate in Basic First Aid Training and given the essential skills to support our staff on the playground and assist with any small injuries that may arise. This is a wonderful opportunity for Year 4 children and helps to support our class value of 'compassion'.

Year 4 Expectations

In Year 4, children are growing in independence and we encourage them to take on more responsibility. Key Points for Parents

- Spelling scores Children will share these with you at home (not written in diaries).
- Independence Children should be able to tie their shoelaces and manage their own ties.
- Toilets and drinks Children may always go if needed, but we encourage them to use breaks rather than the start of lessons when important teaching is taking place.
